BAH

About half of the required allotment changes have been done as of January 25th. Our goal was to have all allotment changes in place by the end of January, but it doesn't appear that is going to happen. A list of all residents not having changed their allotment will be sent to Base Leadership on February 1st. Remember, the new rent rate will start February 1st whether or not your allotment has changed.

COLD WEATHER

We are still experiencing frozen pipes due to the cold weather. Take a few moments and read the WINTER TIPS on page 2. If the temperature drops below freezing, leave a faucet dripping at night. And if you're going to be away from your home, it becomes extremely important to do this.

Also, PLEASE disconnect any hoses from hose bibbs! Failing to do this can result in the hose bibb freezing. Next time you turn it on, you'll get a flood coming out of your wall.

WASHERS AND DRYERS

If anyone needs a washer and dryer, KFH has worked out an arrangement with Appliance Warehouse to provide low cost rentals to our residents. The rental cost is about half what local businesses offer.. They have side by side and stackable units, they deliver and also maintain the machines. WEAPONS IN HOUSING

Residents may keep privately owned firearms and ammunition in their homes. However, NO ONE may carry concealed weapons or firearms and all weapons must be registered with the Base Security Police and comply with KAFBI 31-101, AFI 31-207 and KAFB Supplement 1 thereto.

CLEANER'S LIST

We maintain a list of cleaning vendors at our office. We have no affiliation or relationship with them, but they have proven in the past that their performance meets the standards required by KFH. If your interested, come by and pick up the list. You'll have to contact the vendor(s) and negotiate your own "deal", based on the condition of your house. ***If you are interested in providing cleaning services and want to be included on the list, come by our office and discuss it with us.***

QUIET HOURS

Monday thru Thursday 10PM-6AM
Friday thru Sunday 11PM-6AM

During quiet hours, there should be NO NOISE discernable outside your house. At other times, if you're TV, stereo or party can be heard more than 10 feet away, it's too loud. This applies to vehicles also. If you're car stereo can be heard by residents in their house, it's too loud

TRASH & RECYCLE CONTAINERS

Continues to be a problem. **Please**, put your container(s) out the night before pick up and put them away when it's done. You **CANNOT** leave them in the street, in the front yard, etc.

PETS

Please take care of your pets! Calls are still coming in about pets left outside when it freezes. If you feel a pet is being mistreated, call the Law Enforcement Desk to report it.

VEHICLES

Please "read and heed". We put this in every newsletter because we keep noting violations.

Vehicles can only be on streets, drives or in garages. They can't be driven or parked on sidewalks, yard areas (grass or rock) or common areas. These are vehicles of ANY type – cars, trucks, trailers, motorcycles, motorscooters, ATVs, etc. It's not allowed to take your off road vehicle "off roading" anywhere in housing. Trailers can be parked in housing for NO MORE THAN 24 hours during the week. On weekends it's from Friday afternoon to Monday morning. This applies to ALL trailers.

Other than changing tires, changing a battery, replacing wipers or something similar in nature, working on vehicles on the street, in your drive or in your garage isn't allowed. If the work will take more than 15 to 30 minutes, you have to raise your hood or jack your car up to do the work (other than the tire change) you're probably violating your lease. NOTHING involving changing POL products (oil, grease, anti-freeze, power steering fluid, brake fluid, etc.) can be performed in housing. If your vehicle leaks, get it fixed as quickly as possible. Leaking POL products are prohibited by KFH rules and KAFB regulations.

SPEEDING

STILL A PROBLEM: If you see someone speeding in housing, note the license number, type of vehicle, date, time and location. Call this information in to Security Forces. Base leadership assures me they will follow up on these type calls.

Issues Of Interest:

WINTER TIPS

Disconnect all hoses from exterior faucets. This will prevent the faucet from freezing and leaking into the house.

Leave a faucet dripping at night when temperatures get below freezing.

To ensure maximum efficiency of your furnace, make sure the return air grill is clean and not obstructed.

BULK TRASH PICK UP

The intention of this service is to assist move-ins and move-outs. These are the only pick-ups that will be done. Also, items that we don't pick up at all include appliances, furniture, fences, computers and monitors, hazardous materials and items that are contaminated with such materials. Any item that might have POL product contamination should not be included in bulk pick up items.

TRASH CARTS

Please don't overload your trash cart. You must be able to close the lid when it's placed in the street for pick-up. This helps to keep down on items falling or blowing out and scattering across the property. If your cart is too heavy, the truck will not be able to empty it.

Anyone wishing to get a second trash container may do so by coming by the KFH office and completing the form. Waste Management charges \$8.79 per month for the second cart, and \$28.14 each quarter for once a week pick up and disposal services. The service charge must be paid in advance each quarter.

" Maintenance Corner "

The following listed items are considered to be after-hours emergencies. On-Call Maintenance: 266-0079. Carbon Monoxide Detector or Smoke Alarm Alarming, (Alarming is 3 quick beeps every 5 seconds, if the Detector is chirping once every 15 seconds it just needs the battery replaced; remove the battery and come to the office during normal working hours and we will gladly give you a replacement battery).

- Gas Leaks that set off the Carbon Monoxide Detector.
- Flooding, no water or no Hot Water in the home at all.
- Heater not working at all.
- Oven and Burners not working at all.
- Sewage Back-ups of any type.
- Backed up toilet, if this is the only toilet in the entire home.
- Fire in the home of any type.
- Locked out of the house.

If you experience any of the above, please call the number shown above. If you have a maintenance problem that is not an emergency, call the Maintenance Office the next morning to initiate a work order.
