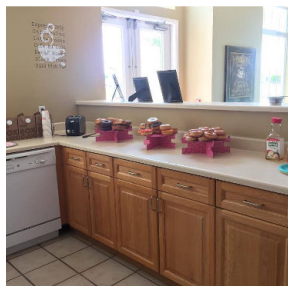

TIPS TO MAKE THE SUMMER A BREEZE

Water Awareness and Summer Safety

No matter where you live, summer and water seem to go together. Here are a few items to keep in mind this season:

With mosquitoes on everyone's mind, eliminate standing water areas, such as bird baths, kid's toys, pails, wading pools, plant saucers or other places where water may accumulate. A child can drown in just a few inches of water in a bucket - adult supervision is essential when kids are around water.
