LIGHTING AND YARD DECORATIONS POLICY

- Holiday decorations and outside lighting are prohibited from being placed higher than the edge of the gutter on the first floor roofline.
- The use of staples, nails, screws, or other mechanical fasteners to attach decorations or lighting to the homes and associated structures is prohibited.
- Plastic clip-on hooks may be commercially obtained and used to attach decorative lighting, garlands etc. Attachment of anything to vinyl siding is prohibited.
- Holiday lighting and decorations may not be erected before Thanksgiving and must be removed no later than January 10th.
- Outside lighting must be Underwriters Laboratories (UL) approved and factory listed for outside use. Running electric cords through windows and doors, or across heating ducts or vent systems is prohibited, as this causes a fire safety hazard.
- All exterior lighting must be "GFI" protected. Residents are reminded that homes have limited amp circuits and care must be taken to prevent overloading.

- Outside decorative lights are to be turned off no later than midnight, except on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, when they are allowed to remain on overnight.
- Outside lights are not authorized during daylight hours. Additionally, electrical decorations must be unplugged when residents are away from the home.
- Resident accepts any and all liability for damages to premises or injuries caused by holiday or decorative lighting and other decorations.
- Holiday lighting and decorations are subject to management's discretion.
- Holiday decorations and outside lighting must be installed in accordance with manufacturer instructions and must be plugged into a GFCI outlet.

Keeping Storm Water Clean is Everybody's Business!


Rainfall on Kirtland Family Housing (KFH) flows across pavement and roads and comes in contact with all types of pollutants ranging from dripped vehicle fluids to accumulated dirt and debris...



This storm water then flows into our gutters and storm drains and even the arroyos...



... Eventually making its way to the Rio Grande River, where polluted storm water can negatively impact water quality that is required for sustainability of aquatic life and wildlife, for recreational purposes, natural aesthetics, and for our drinking water supply.



Sparingly apply pesticides and fertilizers.
Place trash in a sturdy container with a lid.
Do not dump anything into storm drains.
Use the KAFB Auto Hobby Shop or a licensed mechanic for vehicle maintenance and repairs.
Avoid drips and spills by keeping vehicles in good working condition via scheduled maintenance.
Clean-up spills with an absorbent type material. Kitty litter is usually acceptable.
Properly dispose of used oil and vehicle fluids at an approved collection site.
Use a commercial car wash or the do-it-yourself location on KAFB.
Pick-up and properly dispose of all pet waste.

Help prevent storm water pollution by reporting potential problems. Visual signals of storm water pollution include discoloration, surface scum, oil sheen (shiny water), suspended sediment and debris, or a pungent odor coming from a storm drain or outfall pipe. If you suspect pollutants are spilling into a storm drain, call the KAFB Civil Engineering Customer Service Desk at (505) 846-8222 and report the nature and location of the problem.
